# Motel One Campus Restaurant

## Ippolito Fleitz Group

Natural materials and open, haptic surfaces were instilled by Ippolito Fleitz Group into the design of the Motel One Campus Restaurant to create a warm, inviting and opulent interior. Dotted with Oriental elements, this aspect was used throughout the concept – the team was also responsible for designing other areas within the motel – while still assigning an autonomous identity to the dining area.

The two-storey space has wooden furnishings, dark metallic fixtures and a neutral colour palette. A staircase running along the wall creates a vast, inviting zone in the middle of the restaurant. The large floor-to-ceiling glass wall welcomes visitors from the lobby while a canopy of exquisite pendant lamps, resembling Chinese lanterns, serve as an eye-catching centrepiece creating a warm and enticing ambience. The lanterns, window shutters and rear brick wall bring the outdoors inside, creating a piazza-like atmosphere.

Varied seating options offer different zones: at the centre, three tables of differing heights and materials divide the area, enabling multifunctional use. Towards the rear, long rows of tables encourage conversation and casual dining, while at the back of the restaurant, the atmosphere changes into that of a cosy enoteca/bar with low pendant lamps, leather-upholstered benches and wooden cladding.
